President's Report

Dear Members,

I hope this message finds you well. The Management Committee has been very busy over the past few months, and I am excited to share some updates and highlights of our recent activities, collaborations, and Committee developments.

Firstly, I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to Roz Azizi, the current Treasurer.

Roz has been an invaluable asset to the Society and to me personally over the past 7 months. Her contributions, particularly the Treasurer's handbook and her procedural improvements, have laid a strong foundation for future committees to thrive. Roz initially planned to serve only a single term. However, with a holiday coinciding with our Annual Exhibition, she proactively suggested that we find a replacement Treasurer whom she could support and train in preparation for the event. Fortunately for the Society, Cathy Harding, who has a background in accounting, has stepped forward and graciously offered to take on the role as of the first of July. Thank you so much, Cathy. Special thanks are also due to Christine Campbell, who also volunteered to join the Committee; I hope we can find another suitable position for her this year.

I'd also like to extend my thanks to Kate Steel van Gilst and Nicole Mathison for their contributions to the Society. Despite facing challenging personal commitments, they have enabled the Society to continue its mission and navigate a tumultuous period through their joint service as Secretary. However, they have decided to step back, allowing someone with greater capacity for the duties to serve as Secretary pro tempore. Thankfully, both will continue to contribute to the Society. Nicole will focus her attention on seeking out grants to support our mission, and Kate will assist us in expanding our sponsor relationships, both very meaningful roles to the furtherance of our organisation.

Finally, I would like to extend my deepest gratitude to our newly appointed Vice President, Karen Robinson-Foote, who has volunteered to assume the additional responsibilities of Secretary. Karen has already made remarkable progress in organising our Annual Exhibition this year. She has been diligently documenting and streamlining processes to ensure that WSQ's highest-profile annual event runs smoothly and can be more easily organised in the future. Her efforts have already provided me with more time to focus on the Society's strategic priorities; more importantly, they will enable the Committee in the coming year to prioritise establishing programs that further the Society's goals of promoting the appreciation of watercolour as a medium to the broader community particularly outreach to regional artists and young people. Thank you, Karen.

Now, to our recent collaborations. In addition to sponsoring the Australian Watercolour Muster this year, we have also agreed to be Gold-Level Sponsors of the CRE8 Art Prize. This community art prize, organised by Holland Park State High School, provides Brisbane artists with an opportunity to showcase their creativity while encouraging and supporting young people's involvement in the arts. Millard of Lilly-Lee Gallery, who advocated for the inclusion of paper media in the event, brought our attention to this opportunity to sponsor an event that prioritises young people in the arts. These types of events are crucial to our commitment to elevating the profile of watercolour and encouraging engagement among young people. I am very excited about the possibilities events such as these will open up for us.

In April, I shared a business plan for the Society based on our member survey results and research into the arts & culture not-for-profit sector. This plan will guide our future initiatives and ensure we continue to meet the needs of our members. One of the funding avenues I've suggested for financing future initiatives is merchandising. In furtherance of this strategy, the Committee has purchased some WSQ-branded aprons from an Australian supplier. We've also purchased some children's introduction to watercolour kits from the Australian company Tiger Tribe. I'm hopeful these items will sell well at our Annual Exhibition.

Also in April, Karen and I were invited to attend the Royal Queensland Art Society's Workshop Festival Open Day, where we shared flyers about our society and the upcoming Annual Exhibition. We made some interesting acquaintances and are exploring ideas for future collaborations with other societies within the regions.

I'm also delighted to share that Karen seized an unanticipated opportunity to invite renowned AWI member Chan Dissanayake to visit in early August. This provided an excellent opportunity for WSQ to collaborate with RQAS to host events in their Petrie Terrace Gallery. This venture is truly exciting, and I look forward to future collaborative opportunities.

In another unexpected turn of events instigated by our Vice President, I have been in contact with Jane Zandi, the President of the Watercolour Society of Western Australia. She has graciously offered to ensure WSQ's inclusion in collaborations across the Indo-Pacific region, bringing international watercolourists to Australia.

In May, our Sip & Paint Mother's Day workshop, coordinated by Tour de Tea, was a delightful event that garnered very positive feedback and added a few names to our mailing list from participants who enjoyed combining the art of watercolour with the pleasure of tea sampling. I hope we can continue to foster events like this in the future, as they make the medium accessible to people who might be intimidated by watercolour.

This leads to another exciting relationship we've recently entered with the Brisbane-based community services organisation Communify. Communify offers a comprehensive range of services to support vulnerable community members and operates multiple community centres throughout Brisbane. They provide substantial rental discounts for these venues to not-for-profit organisations, and by being registered with them, we expand on our ability to provide watercolour workshops, demonstrations and community-focused events that encourage exploration of watercolour. I've wanted to establish more options for Casual Painting and Sip & Paint-style events to encourage greater community involvement with watercolour, and this broader selection of reasonably priced venues from which to host will greatly further that goal. Anyone interested in leading or helping to coordinate these events, please reach out; I will be happy to support your efforts.

We have also partnered with Senior Art, a local art supply store, to create an exclusive introductory kit branded for our society. The kits have been curated for individuals new to the medium, who may not know where to begin with materials, focusing on good quality, economical options for paper, brushes, and pigments. They feature a split warm-cool primary palette of 3 to 7 transparent or semi-transparent pigments, encouraging new watercolourists to learn colour mixing. These will be available for sale at our upcoming Annual Exhibition and in Senior Art stores. This collaboration aims to provide our members and

the public with reliable materials to support their watercolour journey.

Finally, Jenny Loveday and Des Lambert have organised and shared a special ink-on-rice-paper workshop with Australian-born, international artist David Reid, in late June. Details of this workshop were forwarded to members in late May. The workshop is completely booked, but there are still tickets available for his evening lecture, which will include a discussion of Chinese Art History as it relates to David's artistic journey. If you're available on the 28th of June, the event promises to be quite interesting.

Thank you for your continued support and participation. We look forward to seeing you at our upcoming events and workshops.

Selection by Governor of Queensland

Wynnum Artist, Fellow of Royal Qld. Art Society, Graham W. Smith has had Her Excellency the Honourable Dr. Jeanette Young, Governor of Queensland, select one of his watercolours to go on display in the Vice-Regal residence at the Fernberg Estate in Paddington for 2 years from May 27th, 2025.

This 62 x 80cm watercolour, "Wooroolin Church-Qld", Painting No. 2942, was completed in May 2019 and since then Graham has completed a further 430 paintings.



This painting will accompany 6 other watercolours of Grahams' work that are hanging in the Administration Building since December 2000.

These works were commissioned by the then Governor, Major-General Peter Arnison, in 2000 to depict these historic buildings and residences at the turn of the century as historical pieces after the Fernberg estate had a major external repaint and refurbishment that same year.

As Governor, Her Excellency is the Patron of Royal Qld Art Society at Petrie Terrace Brisbane where Graham was appointed by his peers in 2015 as one of only 23 Fellows currently at the Society out of over 300 members.



WSQ and Tour de Tea – Mother's Day Sip & Paint Event



On 11 May 2025, WSQ and Tour de Tea hosted a delightful Mother's Day Sip & Paint event at the Hub in Tarragindi. The fresh tablecloths we recently purchased, combined with the tea accessories and other staging materials provided by Tour de Tea, created an enchanting environment for creative exploration.

The engagement of the ladies in the group was high, thanks to Clare McFadden, our accessible and engaging instructor. Everyone seemed to love the tea as a refreshing alternative to many alcohol-based events. It was wonderful to see so many people who had never painted before enjoying themselves in our unique medium.

Interestingly, the students inadvertently learned a valuable lesson in choosing the right paper for watercolour. Tour de Tea provided a sheet of cellulose paper for practice and a sheet of paper with 50% cotton content for the final work. No number of lectures could compare to experiencing firsthand the problems presented by cellulose paper: how the paint sits atop the fibres, how larger amounts of water create spotty, dark areas as the sizing breaks down unevenly, how the paper surface eventually deteriorates, how the results of a wet-into-wet wash aren't quite right.










